The Commission is also considering technical amendments to implement <u>Substitute Senate Bill (SSB) 5496 (Chapter 43, Laws of 2022)</u>. <u>SSB 5496</u> updated terminology and references for chiropractors and clarified confidentiality protections in <u>RCW 18.130.070</u> for health professional monitoring programs. Except for revising individual rule sections, a comprehensive review of <u>Chapter 246-808 WAC</u> has not been conducted since 1996.

The Commission will review <u>WAC 246-808-130</u>, <u>Temporary permit: Issuance and duration</u>; <u>WAC 246-808-133</u>, <u>Background Check Temporary Practice Permit; WAC 246-808-140</u>, <u>Thirty-Day Permit; WAC 246-808-051</u>, <u>Military spouse or military-related temporary practice permit (New Section)</u>; and <u>WAC 246-808-010</u>, <u>Definitions</u>.
