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## **State revokes, suspends licenses, certifications, registrations of health care providers**

**OLYMPIA** -- The Washington State Department of Health has revoked or suspended the licenses, certifications, or registrations of the following health care providers in our state. The department has also immediately suspended the credentials of people who have been prohibited from practicing in other states.

The department's Health Systems Quality Assurance Division works with boards, commissions and advisory committees to set licensing standards for more than 80 health care professions (e.g., dentists, nurses, counselors). This information is also available by calling 360-236-4700. Consumers who think a health care provider acted unprofessionally are also encouraged to call and report their complaint.

### **Snohomish County**

In June 2022 the Nursing Assistant Program and **Dani Chea** (NA61105935) agreed to a suspension for at least two years of her registered nursing assistant license. Chea was diagnosed with a mental health disorder after spraying a resident's genitals with Clorox.

### **Whatcom County**

In June 2022 the Home Care Aide Program and **Anna Kay Leamon** (HM60814602) agreed that her home care aide license would be suspended. Leamon lived in the home of two patients she cared for rent-free and received a \$1,200 gift from one of the patients. She also shared that patient's medical information with an unrelated party.
