I want to be screened for hepatitis B. If the tests show that I am at risk for hepatitis B infection, I would like to begin the vaccination series.



I am asking because I understand that screening for hepatitis B is recommended by the CDC for people born in areas where hepatitis B is more common or whose parents were born in those areas, such as Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, and the Pacific Islands.
