

About the Washington State Tuberculosis Services and Standards Manual

Purpose

In Washington State, tuberculosis (TB) care and prevention is governed by state law and rule. The purpose of the TB Services and Standards manual is to provide information and guidance to aid local health jurisdictions (LHJs) in fulfilling the requirements detailed in the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 70.28.005 and the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 246-170. This manual includes information and links to CDC guidelines and TB Centers of Excellence materials with key steps and information needed to fulfill these required TB care and prevention tasks.

Audience

The most likely readers of this manual are TB providers, primarily those working in Local Health Jurisdictions (LHJs) and Tribal Public Health. As a result, the TB Services and Standards Manual has a special focus on the roles, responsibilities and care given by local public health partners. These TB providers may include, but are not limited to nurses, physicians, Health Officers, Regional Medical Officers, epidemiologists, disease intervention specialists and outreach workers from local and state TB programs, clinics, and hospitals.

Eliminating Stigmatizing Language

Judgmental terms and negative connotations of words such as 'defaulter' and 'suspect' may be perceived to place blame for the disease and responsibility for adverse treatment outcomes on the patient. To assist in implementing a change in the use of stigmatizing language the Heartland TB Center of Excellence, the International Union Against TB and Lung Disease, the National Society of TB Clinicians, the global TB community and the Treatment Action Group developed the Stigmatizing Language reference tool to aid in identifying suggested replacement language as a reminder of how our words may affect others.

CHAPTER 17: Statutes and Regulations

Introduction

Purpose

Use this section to access Washington State statutes and regulations that pertain to the treatment and prevention of tuberculosis (TB) in Washington State.

Knowing these statues and regulations will assist local TB programs to better understand their important responsibility to manage and prevent tuberculosis in their community and the legal powers granted by state law to ensure these duties are fulfilled.

The WA DOH TB Program supports the TB recommendations of the CDC. However, when giving guidance to facilities (e.g., occupational health providers) regarding staff and patient/client TB screening requirements LHJs should remember that facilities must fulfill their licensure requirements as stated in the WACs. It will take some time for licensing authorities to consider updating codes related to TB screening and treatment so CDC recommendations and Washington State laws may not always agree. Review the WACs below and contact the individual licensing authority to determine the TB screening requirements needed. For help determining which code or licensing authority a facility operates under, please refer to this reference guide (PDF) or contact the TB Program for assistance()

Washington Administrative Code (WAC)

Regulations of executive branch agencies are issued by authority of statutes. Like legislation and the Constitution, regulations are a source of primary law in Washington State. The WAC codifies the regulations and arranges them by subject or agency.

Revised Code of Washington (RCW)

The Revised Code of Washington (RCW) is **the compilation of all permanent laws now in force**. It is a collection of Session Laws (enacted by the Legislature, and signed by the Governor, or enacted via the initiative process), arranged by topic, with amendments added and repealed laws removed.
