Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: SB 5518 passed in 2022 and codified in RCW 18.59.180, enacted the Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact (Compact) in Washington state. The purpose of the compact is to facilitate interstate practice of occupational therapists (OT) and occupational therapy assistants (OTA). RCW 18.59.180, Article 3, (3), allows the state of Washington to collect fees for the compact. The purpose of the proposal is to charge a fee for granting the privilege of licensure in Washington through the compact. Reasons supporting proposal: RCW 43.70.250 requires that the costs of licensing each profession be fully borne by members of that profession. The Office of Financial Management also requires professions to maintain a reasonable cash reserve to cover fluctuations in cash flow and operating expenses. These fees are needed to ensure the department is in line with RCW 43.70.250 and the fees set are sufficient to recover the costs of issuing a license for compact privileges.
