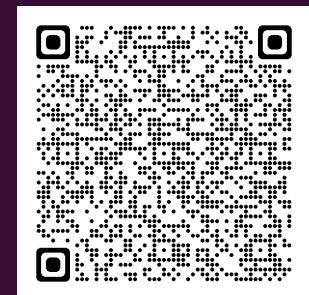

Early Intervention Program (EIP)

EIP is a statewide program in Washington that helps pay for HIV care and medicine. It does this by:

- Working with clinics, labs, and pharmacies to pay the amount you owe for most HIV care and medicine, and
- Finding the most affordable ways to help you pay for the HIV and health care you need.



What Can EIP Pay For?

EIP gets the bills for what you owe and pays the provider for the care and medicine we cover. The provider must have an agreement with EIP. The provider may be a doctor, lab, pharmacy, dentist, or mental health provider.

EIP benefits last for one year. You will need to reapply each year.

EIP does not pay for everything. Using your health insurance, Medicaid, and Medicare can help you get more and stay healthier.

Will I have to apply for other programs or benefits?

You should apply for any health insurance or benefits you qualify for, like:

- Insurance you get from your job.
- Medicaid/Apple Health
- Medicare

EIP can still help with HIV related costs that aren't covered by these programs.

Help Paying for Health Insurance

EIP may be able to pay for the monthly cost of your health insurance. Plans we pay for include:

- Qualified Health Plans - Exchange
- Individual Health Plans – Non-Exchange
- Employer-Sponsored Insurance
- Medicare Part D Plans
- Medicare Advantage Part C Plans
- Healthcare for Workers with Disabilities (HWD)

FIND A PROVIDER

Am I Eligible?

To get into the program, you must:

1. Have proof of HIV status.
2. Live in Washington State.
3. Have gross monthly income at or below 500% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).

*Citizenship status does not affect eligibility.

**Household income: Include legally married spouse, registered domestic partner and dependent children aged 18 and younger.

Fill out an application and attach required documents.
