



# Proposed Changes to Law

# Cottage Food Program

A bill is being proposed in the Washington state legislature to make changes to law (<u>Chapter 69.22 RCW</u>) to switch oversight of Cottage Food Operations from the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Health.

A Cottage Food Permit allows people in Washington to sell certain "nonpotentially hazardous foods," like tortillas, breads, baked goods, or mixed spices, made in their homes.

To help us build our Cottage Food program so that it best serves both makers and consumers of these foods, we want input from current Cottage Food Operators, community members who want to start a home-based food businesses, and food safety specialists.

Certain foods made in a home kitchen for direct sale to the public.

People who sell— or want to sell— foods made in their home kitchens; and people concerned about food safety.

#### **Timeline**

- By July 15, 2024 Sign up for a listening session
- July 19, 2024—Surveys Close
- July 22 and 29, 2024—Online Community Listening Sessions
- Spring 2025—Finalize proposed changes to state Cottage Food law
- Spring 2025—Finalize <u>Environmental</u>
  Justice Assessment
- September 2025—Submit complete proposal for consideration by legislature in January 2026
