Re: Collaborative- Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) Federal Accreditation

Greetings Honorable Tribal Leaders, Partners, and Professionals:

In accordance with chapter <u>43.376 RCW</u>, the <u>Washington State Centennial Accord of 1989</u>, and <u>DOH Consultation</u> <u>and Collaboration Procedure</u>, we invite collaboration on exploration of options related to the sustainability of OTP federal accreditation services from the Washington State Department of Health (DOH).

In addition to state licensure and/or licensure through tribal attestation, all OTPs, must obtain federal accreditation from a <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA)- Approved Accreditation Body (AB)</u>. DOH offers federal AB services at no cost to OTPs. This work is currently funded through General Fund-State (GFS). This has been an important component of the state's effort to address the opioid crisis. However, using GFS funding has reduced resources needed to support the broader required behavioral health agency regulatory work. Currently, most licensed and all tribally owned and/or operated OTPs are accredited by the DOH. Growth in the number of OTPs, new lines of service, and increased oversight requirements mandated by SAMHSA have substantially increased the costs necessary to support the AB program. Therefore, the DOH is seeking input to explore a path forward regarding this service. Please see the <u>OTP Accreditation webpage</u> and <u>Fact Sheet</u> for more information.
