

Host a Safe Medication Return Drop-off Kiosk

It's **FREE** for you and your customers.

Drop-off kiosks are available to your customers whenever your business is open. Kiosks can be located at:

- retail pharmacies
- hospitals and clinics with on-site pharmacies
- law enforcement agencies
- substance use disorder treatment programs*
- long-term care facilities*

You do not pay any costs. Your program operator, Inmar or MED-Project, would pay all costs including purchasing, placing, and maintaining kiosk; providing inner liner supplies; and collection, transportation, and disposal. You would provide floor space, information about how to use the kiosk (when asked), and staff time to make sure your kiosk is always available for your customers to use.

If you are interested in hosting a kiosk, contact our program operators. They will explain how you would work with them to manage and maintain the kiosk. We suggest contacting both operators to determine which best fits your needs.

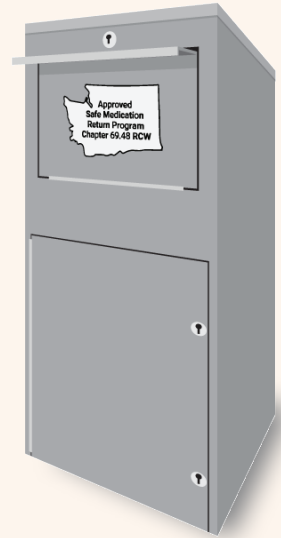

Distribute Mailers for Safe Medication Return

It's **FREE** for you and your customers.
There are two ways to distribute mailers:



1. Become a mailer distributor

If you are a community organization or business and are open to the public at a specific location, you could become a mailer distributor.

Your program operator, Inmar or MED-Project, would provide you with mailers. You would provide counter space, information about how to use the mailers (when asked), and staff time to reorder mailers to make sure they are always available to your customers. Your business location would be publicized on medtakebackwashington.org.

2. Provide mailers on an ad-hoc basis

If you would like to provide mailers at community events or to your clients, but do not have a location that is open to the public or do not want to maintain a consistent supply of mailers, program operators might be able to provide you with up to 250 mailers per order in groups of 50. Your business location would not be publicized on medtakebackwashington.org.

If you are interested in becoming a mailer distributor or providing mailers on an ad-hoc basis, contact our program operators. We suggest contacting both to determine which best fits your needs. Please tell them if you'd like to be publicized on medtakebackwashington.org.

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Mailer distribution tips

- The public can take as many mailers as they need.
- Medication can be mixed in the mailer, either loose or in original containers.
- Mailers must be easy for people to find and take. It's best if people don't have to stand in line or request mailers from staff.
- Please don't sell mailers from other vendors, please only offer our free mailers.

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
