

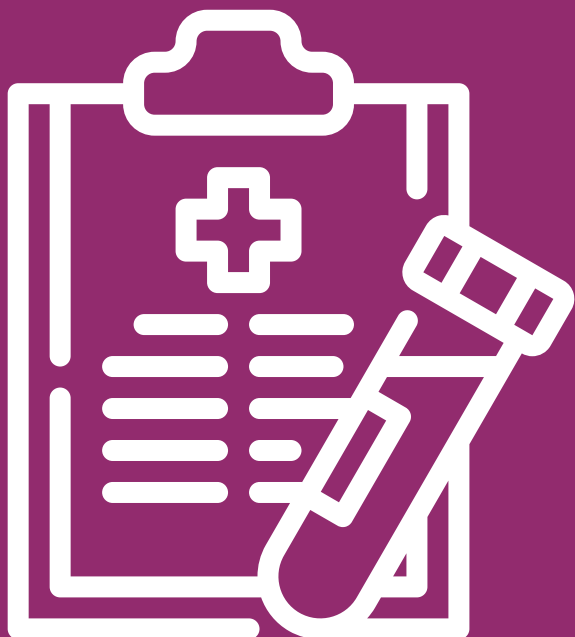

SCREENING:



All individuals who were born in or lived six or more months in endemic countries should be screened for Chagas disease.

- Order a *Trypanosoma cruzi* serologic test. Most commercial laboratories in the US offer a *T. cruzi* serologic test.
- If screening test is positive, consult with the local health jurisdiction (LHJ) in the county of patient residence to forward the specimen to Centers for Disease Control for confirmatory testing using a secondary IgG serology method.
- If confirmatory test is positive, patient should be assessed for treatment and screened for potential cardiac or gastrointestinal complications.
