## Fiscal Year in Review 2024

#### At A Glance

Fund Balance: \$(201,000)

Increased \$11,000

Revenue: \$526,000

• Applications: 421 (+15%)


Renewals: 6,534 (-1%)

### Significant Highlights

- Revenue increased 26% per the 2023 fee change to address the deficit.
- Overall, costs decreased 22%, primarily due to a decline in HELMS obligations and the use of one-time funding to support credentialing backlogs.
- Disciplinary costs grew as post-pandemic caseloads moved through the legal and adjudicative process.

  59%


## Cost Projections

- Average annual cost: \$554,000
- Expense growth rate FY2025: 18%
- Subsequent growth: -13% in FY2026 then 2% annually, driven by inflation, personnelrelated expenses, and disciplinary costs

# Fee Activity Projections

- The department increased fees in FY2023 to return the fund balance to its target reserve level.
- The fund is projected to meet target fund levels by FY2034, leading to a possible fee decrease in 10+ Years.
