Dear Dr. Kenevan:

The Department of Health has completed the review of your exemption request regarding the proposed ambulatory surgery center in Lakewood, within Pierce County. Below is the information considered and the facts relied upon by the Certificate of Need Program in reaching its conclusion regarding your project.

INFORMATION CONSIDERED

- Ambulatory Surgery Center (ASC) exemption application received May 15, 2014
- Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 70.38
- Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 246-310
- Washington Secretary of State and Department of Revenue information obtained from the respective websites
- Department of Health external provider look-up
- Department of Health Integrated Licensing and Regulatory System (ILRS)
- Certificate of Need historical files

FACTS CONSIDERED

- Avalon Lakewood, PLLC has been an active Washington State corporation since December 2003. The corporation has one governing member: Robert Kenevan.
- Avalon Lakewood, PLLC is also registered with the Department of Revenue.
- Avalon Clinic for Cosmetic Surgery is not a registered corporation in Washington State.
- According to the Avalon Clinic website, Avalon Clinic has one practice site located at 6103 Mount Tacoma Drive Southwest in Lakewood, within Pierce County.
- The exemption application identifies three physicians that would have access to the proposed ASC. The physicians are listed on the following page.

- The application indicates that, as the owner of the practice and the proposed ASC, you do not intend to use the ASC.
- The proposed ASC would be operated under the corporation known as Avalon Lakewood, PLLC.
- Procedures to be performed at the ASC are those typically associated with cosmetic plastic surgery, such as breast augmentation or reduction, rhinoplasty, and liposuction.
- The proposed ASC would not be operated under a management agreement.

CONCLUSION

New health care facilities are subject to Certificate of Need review. [RCW 70.38.105(4)(a)] Facilities subject to review include ambulatory surgical facilities. [RCW 70.38.025(6)] Such facilities are defined by WAC 246-310-010(4) to mean:

[A] ny free-standing entity, including a ambulatory surgery center that operates primarily for the purpose of performing procedures to treat patients not requiring hospitalization. The term does not include a facility in the offices of private physicians, or dentists, whether in individual or group practice, if the privilege of using the facility us not extended to physicians or dentists outside the individual of group practice.

The proposed ASC does not qualify for the exemption in the second sentence of WAC 246-310-010(4). This conclusion is based on the following information provided in the application.

- The ASC would be used by a physician that is not at least 75% employed by the practice. Dr. Potyondy spends approximately 80% of his time at the Sonobello practice in Tacoma.¹
- Additionally, it is unclear from the documents obtained from the licensure section of Department of Health whether Dr. Goldflies' physician license is suspended. The status of the physician license must be clarified before an exemption is considered.

Accordingly, the ASC is subject to prior Certificate of Need review and approval before it is established. This conclusion is consistent with prior Certificate of Need decisions. Enclosed is a copy of the Certificate of Need rules, (WAC 246-310), regulations (RCW 70.38), and a blank application form should you wish to pursue this project.
