<b>Community-based youth suicide prevention</b>	<a href="#">Beth Mizushima</a> , Grays Harbor Public Health & Social Services Department	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• When Regional Support Networks were transitioning to Behavioral Health Organizations, Grays Harbor created an integrated model for youth suicide prevention that included:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Community Education</li> <li>○ School-Based Prevention</li> <li>○ Clinical Pathway to Care</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Community education focuses on stigma reduction and increasing community members' skills in preventing suicide. Grays Harbor used QPR since it's available in multiple languages and training opportunities are profession-specific.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ They also offered free gatekeeper training kits to incentivize agencies to have a staff member certified as a trainer, thereby building sustainability.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• School-based prevention includes working with the Educational Service District (ESD) and directly with school districts.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ ESD 112 held a <a href="#">SMART team training</a>, which allowed schools to have select staff trained and many then updated their crisis plans. As a team, they continue to meet and some schools have MOUs so staff can be called in to support a school with an urgent need, like postvention response.</li> <li>○ Hoquiam School District was the first WA school to use <a href="#">Hope Squad</a>, a peer program that all schools in Utah have access to. The program requires that the school partner with a local public or behavioral health. Schools that implement Hope Squad hold QPR trainings, including with parents. The local college and two other school districts in Grays Harbor will also implement Hope Squad this year.</li> <li>○ Elementary schools use the <a href="#">Good Behavior Game</a>.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Question: How much did it cost for Utah to take Hope Squad statewide?               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Answer: About \$500/school and Hope Squad provided a discount so this could happen. Not all schools have implemented it.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Question: What is a good starting point for communities prioritizing youth suicide prevention?               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Answer: Many staff work on multiple projects and you never know which relationships could align with suicide prevention work. Often informal conversations lead to plans.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Question: What metrics were tracked over the 5 years?               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Answer: Number of people trained, training for systems changes (like ZS), when people get screened for suicide and outcomes (although tracking this follow-up care is difficult). Paid a partner to pull their own electronic medical record data. For Hope Squad, pre and post surveys and number of referrals to counselors.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For Clinical Pathway to Care they work with clinical partners and offered Zero Suicide (ZS) and QPRT training. They are also working with one of their local hospitals to implement ZS in in their 3 primary care clinics, and Dr. Ursula Whiteside is offering technical assistance.               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>“Where we got traction was connecting with the right people at the right time.”</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
<b>Recent occupation research update</b>	<a href="#">Therese Hansen</a> , DOH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>New CDC study came out on <a href="#">suicide risk for veterinarians and veterinary technicians</a>. It included data from 2003-2014 from 18 states (WA was not included).               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Found that poisoning was the most common cause of death among veterinarians. Pentobarbital, a euthanasia solution, was the drug most commonly used. Most pentobarbital poisonings occurred at home.</li> <li>This indicates that training on euthanasia procedures <u>and</u> access to pentobarbital are some of the key factors contributing to the problem of suicide among veterinarians. This finding was not true for veterinary technicians and technologists who more often died from opioid poisoning compared with veterinarians.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Question: When looking at mandatory suicide education for dentists, they had similar issues so maybe should look at training veterinarians?               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Answer: DOH included this recommendation in the <a href="#">2018 Suicide Education Study</a> and the first <a href="#">legislative report on the agriculture task force and pilot</a>.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>Supplemental decision package discussion</b>	Therese Hansen, DOH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The current supplemental decision package draft includes:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Funding for 2 DOH suicide prevention specialists</li> <li>0.5 FTE DOH epidemiologist for suicide data</li> <li>A postvention study</li> <li>Expanding the agriculture work</li> <li>Grants for tribal nations</li> <li>A suicide prevention community health worker module</li> <li>A health promotion campaign with the YMCA and Safer Homes</li> <li>Funding OSPI’s regional behavioral health coordinators (OSPI will be submitting their own DP for this; DOH DP will reference this work)</li> </ul> </li> <li>The decision package will be finalized and submitted in Sept.</li> </ul>

Send her edits or if you would like to be added.</li> <li>• <b>Question:</b> Should the postvention workgroup continue to meet? Perhaps even looking to do a suicide prevention summit in WA.</li> <li>• Seattle Children's is looking at how to have a more robust mental health presence in the region.</li> <li>• Update on DBHR's community suicide prevention grants <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ RFA for the community services draft is under review by some of the Action Alliance members. Based on the input received we will update the RFA and plan to have it out mid to late September.</li> <li>○ <b>Request:</b> We have also asked for volunteers from the Action Alliance and will be asking the Mental Health Promotion workgroup for people that are interested in helping review the applications. Please contact <a href="#">Sarah Mariani</a> if you are interested.
