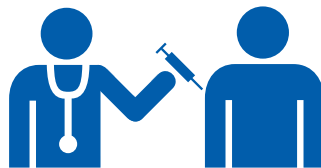
What is hepatitis A and who's at risk?

Hepatitis A is a liver infection caused by the hepatitis A virus. It is very contagious.

Gay or bisexual men are at risk of getting hepatitis A. The virus is spreading from person to person and causing outbreaks around the country.

If you are a gay or bisexual man, protect yourself and others from hepatitis A

Get vaccinated

Diarrhea



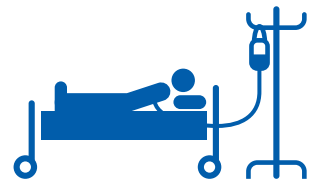
